Minutes of the Meeting held on Monday September 21st at 10 a.m.

Chairman: Ken Griggs Secretary: Maurice Sanders

1. Welcome to Members and receipt of Apologies

Ken welcomed the 25 other members attending the meeting. There were 16 Apologies and 3 proxy forms were registered. Ken advised the meeting that the Club's recently approved Rules had been rejected by the OFT on a financial technicality. Minor changes to two Rules were required and this would have to be presented at an SGM. This meeting was therefore being conducted under the present Club Constitution.

2. Acceptance of the Minutes of the 2019 AGM (June 17) and the Special General Meeting (August 27 2020 – Revised Club Rules)

There were no comments on the draft minutes of the 2019 AGM. Maurice moved and Richard Back seconded that the minutes be accepted as a true record of the meeting.

Carried.

Maurice advised that the draft SGM minutes tabled at this AGM were slightly different to those circulated with the Annual Report. There were no comments. Maurice moved and Ross Shardlow seconded that the minutes be accepted as a true record of the meeting.

Carried.

3. Reports

a. President's Report

Ken noted that his report had been circulated and thanked all members who had made his job easier, particularly those mentioned in his report.

Ken thanked his outgoing Committee and welcomed the new Committee.

b. Treasurer's Report

(i) Acceptance of Treasurer's Report

Wayne Parker was pleased to report that in the financial year to March 2020 the Club had made a profit, even when considering the significant donations made to charities. Since the Club closed in March 2020, the accounts were not affected by the closure. Wayne noted that

Redcliffe was a small club with significant expenditure. Some maintenance work had been done during the year and a dealing machine had been refurbished.

Maree Filippini asked about the income shown under "Social Committee". Wayne stated that this was raffle ticket sales. Maree suggested that perhaps this should be shown as such in the accounts. Maree also asked why no rent was shown for the Clubhouse. Wayne replied that the rent was \$1 p.a. which the Council did not collect. Following a query, Wayne noted that the share of cleaning costs for the entrance with the Snooker Club had been agreed when the Clubhouse was first opened and suggested that the new Committee review this arrangement.

Wayne moved and Jill Hanley seconded that the Treasurer's Report be accepted.
Carried.

(ii) Acceptance of Executive Officers' Honorarium

Wayne proposed and Ross seconded that the honorarium for the President, Secretary and Treasurer be raised from the present \$200 to \$300. **Carried.**

(iii) Acceptance of the proposed Table Fees

Wayne proposed and Jenny Reid seconded that table fees remain at \$5 for members, \$6 for visitors, half-price for youth members and free for members over 90 years of age. **Carried.**

(iv) Acceptance of the proposed Annual Membership Fee

Wayne advised the meeting that under the new Rules, when registered, ABF and QBA annual fees would be collected separately. In order for the total annual payment to be a whole number of dollars, Wayne proposed and Magdeline Wong seconded that the annual member's fee should be \$9.80 for home and away members. After discussion, the motion was **carried.**

c. Auditors' Report

(i) Acceptance of Auditors' Report

There were no comments on the report, which Jill Hanley proposed and Thea Hobson seconded be accepted. This was **carried.**

(ii) Appointment of Auditor for fy 2020/21

Wayne noted that the auditors' cost had changed little and proposed they be reappointed for this financial year. This was seconded by Jenny Reid and **carried.**

4. Election of the 2020/21 RBC Management Committee

Prior to the present Committee retiring, Richard Back stated that he appreciated the Covid-19 pandemic had made operating the Club more difficult and wished to thank the Committee for all their work in getting the Club re-opened, The meeting agreed with Richard's comments.

Ross Shardlow read a statement from Fay Jeppesen, who apologised for being unable to attend due to a family commitment. She thanked the current Committee, commended members who had played on-line or at home and thanked the members who had nominated for the new Committee.

Ken reported that nominations had been received for the following:

President – Fay Jeppesen, proposed Max Kershaw and seconded Steve Woodrow.

Treasurer – Wayne Parker, proposed Maurice Sanders and seconded Annette Hyland.

Committee – Annette Hyland, proposed Carolyn Adcock and seconded Wayne Parker.

Committee – Steve Woodrow, proposed Fay Jeppesen and seconded Max Kershaw.

These nominees were automatically elected.

Ken then sought nominations from the floor for the remaining Committee positions.

Maya Widomski proposed Sandra Routley for Vice-President, but this was declined.

The following were nominated:

Vice-President – Ross Shardlow, proposed Steve Woodrow seconded Maree Filippini.

Secretary – Melissa Weber, proposed Steve Woodrow and seconded Magdeline Wong.

Committee – Ron Elmes, proposed Ken Griggs and seconded by Wayne Parker.

There were no other nominees for these vacancies and they were automatically elected.

There was some discussion about the validity of the nomination of Ron Elmes, as he was absent and it was agreed that the members present would accept his nomination subject to the new Committee's agreement.

PRESIDENT'S REPORT

With a shortened period of office for the current committee, they certainly hit the ground running. Firstly, with rescheduling 2020 championship events and preparation of the 2021 Program. The roles of the committee were defined in revised Position Descriptions with various responsibilities allocated. Each committee member has been invited to prepare a report for inclusion in the Annual Report. I wish to sincerely thank the members of the Management Committee for their enthusiasm and diligence in completing the various tasks necessary for the smooth running of the club.

There are a number of members who complete behind the scenes tasks to ensure the functionality of the various areas of the club. I would like to thank our Providore Magdeline Wong and our head dealer Peter Murray, our Bridge Teacher Sue Kennard, our Club Recorder Sandra Routley, together with various members who help in a range of roles of Director, Bridge Mate, Dealers, Librarian, Masterpoint and Membership Secretary, and Assistant Masterpoint officer and assistants to our Bridge Teacher.

A new role that has necessitated during this year has been the Covid entry personnel to ensure compliance with our Covid Plan, which also included collection of playing fees, and we thank these members for their ongoing support.

What a year - masks on - masks off; 9 tables (of 4), 12 tables, 19 tables, 12 tables, back to 19 tables, requiring various revisions of the Covid Plan, however all have been necessary to ensure the ongoing safe continuation of bridge play in a face-to-face environment.

While we had 28 members not renew their membership, our membership is steady at 191. With the resumption of bridge lessons in February it is pleasing to see 28 beginners enjoying their supervised play after 12 weeks of lessons, and we hope they continue and join our Club. The introduction of the Friday Novice and Rookie session has been well received and with the reintroduction of the Tuesday evening session, our club is back to offering the same number of sessions as pre-Covid.

During this year we have prepared a Shared Use Agreement for maintenance and cleaning with the Redcliffe Snooker Club, which formed part of the new Lease Agreement signed with the Moreton Bay Regional Council. Our new Club Rules were approved by the Office of Fair Trading. A monthly Bridge Buzz newsletter was initiated to keep members informed of committee decisions and what is happening around the club.

It was disappointing that the 3 way interclub competition was cancelled due to the withdrawal of the Moreton-Bribie Club. Unfortunately it was decided that no fundraising would be held on President's Day this year. We have a growing number of members who are participating in Novice and Open Congresses who are advancing their experience levels in competition with some success.

Despite the Covid restrictions the club has continued to have some social activities. Firstly Alan Metcalf organised a bridge social group of 23 to Tangalooma in October, then Melbourne Cup bridge day was held at the club, organised by Ken and Alan, with lunch at the RSL. We had a successful Christmas party for 95 members and guests at the Moreton Bay Boat Club.

I wish to thank members for their on-going support of our changing environment and compliance with the necessary directives and I wish the new committee success in the future leadership of the club.

EDUCATION REPORT 2020-21

OVERVIEW

Like most sporting and community clubs the management committee (MC) noticed below average attendance for the first couple of months after the club's reopening in July 2020. Whilst this slow return of members was somewhat predictable, of particular concern was the absence of so many of our novice players (novice players comprise approx 50% of our members). The following initiatives were approved by your MC to try and correct this imbalance.

MENTORING

At the first meeting of the new management committee following the AGM, a mentoring program - MORP (mentoring of rookie program) was approved and implemented shortly thereafter.

A rookie is defined as a person who has less than 30 master points, irrespective of the length of time that they have been playing. The concept was designed for rookies to be entitled to a minimum of four sessions with an approved mentor thus gaining a better insight into bidding and playing techniques. To date over 30 rookies have availed themselves of this opportunity. I wish to thank the 18 mentors who gave up their time to support this program.

NOVICE SESSION FRIDAY PM

Given the decline in members attendance at the previous open session on Friday pm sessions, the MC agreed to creating a Novice session on Fridays. This initiative provides an environment whereby novice players can feel comfortable to develop and enjoy a game of bridge against players of a similar standard. The parameters that were set in place for eligibility were players less than 100 master points or a rookie playing with an approved mentor. The MC is happy with the response with an average of about 10 tables per session initially and it is expected that this will increase significantly when new members from the beginner class join the club.

BEGINNERS LESSONS

Sue Kennard has done a magnificent job in leading this teaching of the intricacies of bridge. An average of 30 participants attended each sessions and the club has benefited from many new members joining our club. Sue was strongly supported by a group of helpers. Gordon Gemmel and Wayne Parker deserve special mention as they attended every session. Wayne also filled in as teacher when Sue was absent due to ill health. Other members who were regular helpers included Fay, Max, Jill, Magdeline and Ross

In summary, overall, I believe that establishing MORP, a successful beginners teaching class, and commencement of a novice session on Fridays will underpin solid growth of membership in our great club.

Without your help we could not play Bridge as we must have people officiating at all Master Pointed Sessions.

Covid restrictions certainly presented serious challenges to the Club's program with some events completely cancelled or rescheduled. The 2021 Club Championship Teams event survived and was held on March 11th. It's a popular day and was very ably directed by Alan Gibson. GNOT Club Heats were also played, on May 20th, whilst the Club Championship Individual which started on June 3rd is currently awaiting completion on June 17th. At this point in time, all other scheduled Special Events will be played, subject to Covid restrictions.

One of the more important tasks for the Tournament Organiser is to prepare the Program Booklet. It takes a lot of time and effort and I want to acknowledge the work put in by Wayne Parker, Sandra Routley and Annette Hyland in helping me with this year's Booklet.

It is very important that the Club plans for the future and identifies members who may want to become Directors. A request was put out via the Newsletter and I am pleased to say we have a couple of people who are showing some interest and have started the process. Our club is very fortunate that we have several very experienced Directors still involved and willing to help in their ongoing training. It's not easy and requires a substantial commitment.

TREASURER'S REPORT

The pandemic affected us in many ways and as a result it is not possible to compare the club's financial result with previous years, however I can report that we have fared better than most clubs considering that some bridge clubs have closed. Members may be aware that the Scrabble Club no longer leases our premises and the Redcliffe Sub-branch of the TPI have been unable to meet in our clubroom because of social distancing requirements and other health reasons.

Our **total income** (\$46,278.33) reflects a loss in rental income and table fees during the closure of the club from April-July 2020, many events were cancelled during the year and the management committee decided not to accept visitors into our club under our Covid-Plan. I am happy to say that visitors are now welcomed back into the club because of the low transmission of the virus in our community.

We were able to keep our **total expenses** (\$50,929.96) low during the year putting our cleaning contract, maintenance of our electronic front door and air-conditioning units on hold during the club closure. There were savings in our catering costs and prize monies and as required in our new By-Laws, free games were recorded in our expenses for the first time. We had a successful Christmas Party at the Moreton Bay Boat Club which cost a little bit more than last year, but I am sure that all members would agree – it was a great venue and celebration which allowed all our volunteers to have a day off and enjoy the occasion.

Another new expense to the club was our Covid costs which included cleaning materials like additional hand sanitiser, table wipes and the introduction of our new Pay-wave equipment which reduces the handling of cash at entry into our clubroom. The Australian Bridge Federation decided to assist clubs with these additional costs by reducing the ABF Levy for members for the 2021/22 year. Our management committee has also decided to absorb the transaction fees of 1.6% for the use of the Square Terminal and not to pass this cost onto members.

We were having a lot of problems with our photocopier and the previous committee decided to upgrade the unit before the pandemic was discovered, the new Fuji Photocopier cost \$7,732.00. Unfortunately, during the year the office air-conditioning unit also failed and had to be replaced at a cost of \$1,870.00, so taking everything into account I believe that the club is in an exceptionally good position.

The club had \$380,000 invested in term deposits with Suncorp Bank at a rate of 1.7% during the last financial year, however, while we still have \$380,000 invested, this rate will fall to 0.4% over the next 12 months which will affect our future income. The **total net assets** of the club on the 31st of March 2021 were \$431,329.06 – which is a loss of \$4,651.63 or 1.6% below that of the previous year.

Finally, I can report that the club has adequate insurance cover provided through the ABF for:

1. Directors and Officers Insurance
2. Voluntary Workers Insurance - \$ 2,500,000.00 per occurrence
3. Public Liability Insurance - \$20,000,000.00, and

A Business Pack with Tony Bemrose Insurance to cover our office equipment.

Statement provided by the Proposer:

Both By Law 9.3 (a) & 9.3 (d) must be amended on the grounds that they are exclusive, punitive, discriminatory and definitely not in the "SPIRIT OF THE GAME".

When a person has their membership application approved they become a fully-fledged member of the Club. They are not an associate member. Their only reason for joining a bridge club is to play bridge – not to take advantage of any benefits (not their primary interests) provided by clubs such as the RSL, Boat Club & Football Clubs. Associates pay less membership and have no voting rights.

An away Member of a bridge club pays the same joining fee and yearly subscription fee as a home club Member. The only difference being payment of the QBA & ABF levies – these are paid to the home club. From the moment of acceptance they have voting rights.

Why therefore are they put on probation for 3 months before they can participate in club competitions?

If they are an accepted Member they should be encouraged to participate in all Club activities rather than having restrictions placed upon them.

Redcliffe members have joined, and enjoyed the hospitality of many clubs throughout Brisbane, without any restrictions being imposed. Surely we can offer our away members the same hospitality.

Motion 10: That By-Law 9.3 (d) be replaced with the following:

For Interclub events Members representing Redcliffe Bridge Club shall be determined by the Management Committee.

Motion 11: That By-Law 9.3 (b) be replaced with the following:

For GNOT qualifying heats held by the club, a minimum of 3 players for one team at the table at any time must be members of the Redcliffe Bridge Club, and every player must be a current member of a club in the Brisbane Zone. Eligibility and entry requirements shall otherwise be in accordance with QBA regulations.

Statement by Proposer:

I'd like to remove the 3 month membership requirement to simplify administration and compliance with our By-Laws. When we held the 2020 Championship Pairs event there was one pair who were listed on our website probably for a few weeks before it was noticed that they were not going to meet the 3 month membership requirement. I had the unpleasant task of informing them shortly before the event that they were not eligible to play. A similar thing happened recently with entries for the GNOTs, and a similar incident occurred when I was on the committee two years ago. Although in theory it might seem a simple task to check for eligibility prior to accepting entries and posting them on our website, in practice it is not always happening. This results in some degree of discomfort and angst for the committee member who has to inform them, and for the entrant who finds out they are not eligible to play, and for their partner/team mates. I believe our By-Laws should be as simple as possible, otherwise policing them will be a disincentive for members to serve on committee.

Motion 12: That we endorse the provision of Life Membership to Sandra Routley.

Proposed: Fay Jeppesen **Seconded:** Steve Woodrow

The Management Committee has endorsed this motion noting that Sandra meets the requirements of By-Law 11.3 having provided significant meritorious service to the Club in various areas as follows: (a) First joined Redcliffe Bridge Club in 1986. Has achieved playing honours in various club competitions. (b) Was Vice-President in 2011 and 2012, and served on the Management Committee in 2016 and 2017. While Vice-President she had a lead role in the relocation of the club and establishment of the current club premises. (c) Teacher of bridge 2002-03; conducted advanced lessons for players and has been a participant in various mentoring programs for beginner players. (d) Part of sub-committee in 2011 to formulate and digitalise the Club Constitution; Secretary to the sub-committee in 2019-20 to formulate new

Club Rules and By-Laws. Has responsibility of the Club Recorder role in 2021. (e) Been a Club Director since 2000, served as Tournament Organizer, Congress Convener and provides ongoing mentoring to trainee Directors. (f) Co-authored the Redcliffe Club History.

Motion 13: That we endorse the provision of Life Membership to Helen Chapman.

The Management Committee has endorsed this motion noting that Helen meets the requirements of By-Law 11.3 having provided significant meritorious service to the Club in various areas as follows: (a) First joined Redcliffe Bridge Club in 1995. Has achieved playing honours in various club competitions and has represented the Club in both GNOT and GNP finals in Sydney and Canberra. (b) Was Vice-President 2001-02; served on Committee 2003 and 2007; was Secretary 2007-2009; helped secure government grants to enable the Club to occupy the Sutton Street premises in 2002 and secured a grant for a dealing machine. (c) Became a qualified Teacher of Bridge in 2003 and has conducted Beginner courses, both day and night, introduced supervised play and taught advanced lessons in bridge. (d) Chaired the Sub-committee to review the Club Constitution and By-Laws 2019-20. Assisted in the introduction of RAP scoring program.
