ABF NEWS

To assist with the cost of managing Covid19, the ABF recognises that clubs are losing money Australia-Wide and Redcliffe is no exception. They have responded by reducing the Capitation Fees to help clubs and their members for 2021 from \$16.10 to \$10.00, this means that clubs will only be charged \$10.00 for the ABF Levy.

Other Clubs are further addressing the situation by raising their table fees to cover these increased costs. Northern Suburbs will soon increase their table fees to \$8.00 and Toowong's table fees are \$7.00 for members and \$9.00 for visitors (reduced rates apply when a book of 10 coupons is purchased).

Redcliffe is supporting members by absorbing these losses including sanitising and cleaning costs and the club is moving towards cash-free payments.

BRIDGE BUZZ—February 2021

FROM THE PRESIDENT—Fay Jeppesen

Another bumpy Covid month for our Victorian friends, which reinforces the on going requirement to maintain social distancing, hand sanitisation, and staying home if un-well. Our existing Covid processes were reviewed at our recent management committee meeting, as we are aware that some clubs have ceased to complete temperature checking upon entry. It was decided that there would be no change to our existing entry procedures.

The club received advice from the Queensland Bridge Association (QBA) regarding a meeting held with the Queensland Sports Federation (QSF). The key necessary requirements are for accurate contact tracing records to be maintained for a minimum of 6 weeks by the club. Our club policy is for members who are playing, details are recorded through the Bridgemate entry of players for each session, with a spreadsheet of all members with their contact details maintained. Committee members or other non playing members undertaking additional tasks, e.g. dealing and our contractors sign in on a contact tracing register upon entry. Players undertaking our learner program on Saturday are required to sign in each time they attend lessons. Please ensure if you change email address, home address or contact phone number that the Secretary is advised accordingly. Some clubs have introduced a QR Code check in for members as used in restaurants. If you would like to assist with the roster for Covid entry, please contact Ron Elmes who would welcome some additional volunteers to help.

An additional requirement by the QSF is to ensure that clubs only include measurements of the playing room, in determining the maximum numbers of players for 1 per 2 sq. metre rule. Our club complies in this regard and our plan is detailed in the club Covid policy document.

QSF also advised that discussion is ongoing on whether clubs can stop unvaccinated people into the club rooms. QSF believe clubs will make these important decisions when vaccinations have been given to over 70% of the population, and will provide further ongoing information in this regard.

Our new session was introduced on Friday 5 February for Novice players and also for more experienced players providing mentoring. This session was well received with 8 ½ tables, which grew to 11 tables on 12 February. The committee has approved 4 club-funded mentor sessions for each rookie with less than 30 Masterpoints. Additionally the committee has approved that a player with any number of Masterpoints can play with a rookie with less than 30 Masterpoints. There is no change to the novice players who have less than 100 Masterpoints to partner in this session. Thank you to Ross for his ongoing support to establish this session. We welcome back some players for the first time since March 2020 and hope you enjoy your experience back at the club bridge table.

On Saturday 6 February, 33 enthusiastic bridge learners attended Sue Kennard's first teaching session for 2021. It was very encouraging to see that this grew to 36 on 13 February, with some of the players who commenced classes in 2020 returning. Sue was ably assisted by Ross, Gordon, Max, Sue Lind, Wayne and I in providing advice to new players during card play. We welcome you to our Club and hope you enjoy this new adult learning experience and make new friendships.
