Some members have been enquiring about Pianola and MyABF lately, so now is a good time to go over some of the benefits of these programs:

PIANOLA ... is a smart tool to manage bridge clubs and to give players a new way to analyse results and find partners. In our club, Wayne Parker and Fay Jeppesen are the administrators of Pianola and this program is used to communicate with members (by email) to give you general information about the club as well as your recent bridge results.

Details on how to use Pianola have been put on our website under the *Documents* tab, if you do not have access to Pianola please contact Wayne in the first instance – in some cases, you may have to contact Pianola Support in the United Kingdom by email to fix the problem. All new members will be sent an email inviting them to join Pianola and they must click the link in the message to set up their account. The club pays Pianola for this service and there is no cost to our members.



MyABF ... the Australian Bridge Federation has been investing heavily in technology for the past five years, the MyABF technology platform is designed to support all Australian clubs and players by simplifying the administration of clubs and bridge events.

Nearly all bridge events (mainly Congresses) nationwide now use MyABF as the portal, providing players with the information they require and the ability to enter and pay their fees seamlessly. Some clubs have transitioned to using MyABF for their club management allowing their members to pay their table fees through their MyABF Account. Currently, only 47.3% of our members have registered with MyABF, it is easy to set up an account and it is free – simply go online to www.myabf.com.au/accounts/register enter your ABF number, your name, your email address and password and that's it. You need to be registered to play in any congress around Australia.

While MyABF is already offering significant savings and benefits to clubs, there are still three core elements to be done in the future:

- 1. Complete the club membership module to enable clubs to retire existing systems
- 2. Integrate the Masterpoint Centre, and
- 3. Integrate a scoring program with MyABF to reduce errors and overheads.

If you have any further questions, visit the ABF website or talk to Wayne and he may be able to answer your questions. MyABF is the future of bridge in Australia, and it will catch up with us eventually. So far the ABF have invested \$900,000 into this project and members can expect the annual capitation fees (levies) and masterpoint costs (green, red and gold) to rise in the future.

Bridge Education...

We have recently completed four Fridays of supervised play, which was greatly appreciated by those present. We anticipate running some intermediate lessons later in the year for the more advanced players and hope that these will be well attended.



Directors Corner ... ALERTS

The purpose of an alert is to draw the opponents' attention to a call with special meaning or a meaning they may not expect.

Some bids are self-alerting. These include cue bids of the opposition suit, 2C Stayman and most bids at the 4 level or higher. Conventional opening bids at the 4 level are alertable.

- Alerts are made by circling a partner's bid and saying "Alert"
- Unless asked by an opponent, it is highly improper to voluntarily explain the meaning of the bid
- If asked to explain the meaning of a bid, it's also improper to say "I'm taking it to mean..." or "I'm treating it as.....". This provides unauthorised information to partner.
- Alert a 1NT response after an intervening bid if it doesn't promise a stopper in the overcalled suit
- An opening bid of 1C or 1NT requires an announcement, not an alert.
