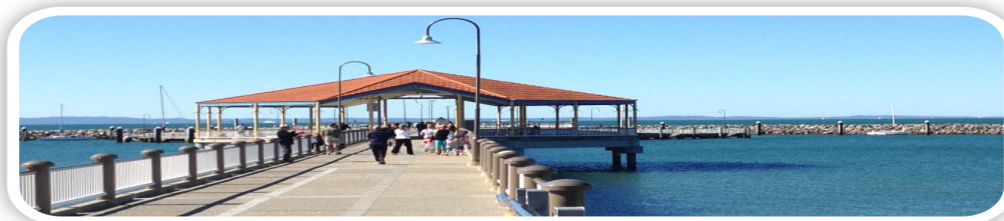

## Honorary Life Membership

This honour is bestowed on members who have been nominated by the Management Committee and who have had that nomination approved at a general meeting of the Redcliffe Bridge Club.

The criteria for being eligible to be nominated is listed below in By-Law 11 and it is reserved for those members who have made an exceptional contribution to the Redcliffe Bridge Club over a significant period of time.

### By-Law 11. HONORARY LIFE MEMBERSHIP

**11.1** Any member granted Honorary Life Membership of the club on the recommendation of the Management Committee with the approval of the members at a general meeting will be exempt from paying club, QBA and ABF membership fees.

**11.2** The Management Committee shall decide by majority vote if the nomination meets the key criteria and if so, will pass the nomination onto the next AGM. The Secretary shall

forthwith notify the proposer in writing of the acceptance or rejection of the nomination.

**11.3** The nominee must have been a member of the Club for not less than 10 years and have performed significant meritorious service for the club for at least five (5) years in two (2) or more of the following areas:

- a) As an executive or ordinary member of the Management Committee;
- b) As a teacher for the Club;
- c) In areas outside the committee over and beyond that expected of an ordinary member;
- d) As a Director, and
- e) As a good ambassador for the Club.

**11.4** The proposer shall prepare a full testimonial of the nominee and their achievements to be presented at the Annual General Meeting to support the nomination.

**11.5** The nomination shall be signed by the nominee, a proposer and seconder, who must be financial members of the club.

## Honorary Life Membership—Maree Filippini

It gives me great pleasure to support the nomination of Maree Filippini for Honorary Life Membership of the Redcliffe Bridge Club.

Maree has made significant contributions to the Redcliffe Bridge Club and has given exceptional service to the club over many years. Those of you who are fairly recent members of the club would not be aware of all that Maree has done in past years.

In 2008 Maree joined the club which was then located in Sutton Street. She served on the Management Committee in 2010 and in 2010, 2011 and 2012, did the catering for the Christmas Party lunch, accepting only expenses incurred. In those days, the Christmas Party was held in our club rooms.

Maree was President of the Redcliffe Bridge Club during 2011 and 2012, a period of great change for the club. It was during this time, in 2011, that a phone call was made by the then Redcliffe City Council to ask whether the club would be interested in putting in an expression of interest to relocate to the old Redcliffe Bowls Club, our current premises.

The Management Committee at the time made the decision that we would accept the council's offer to submit an expression of interest and so began a period of intense activity, overseen by Maree. The biggest job before that could even begin was to create an electronic copy of the Constitution that had to be approved by the then Department of Fair Trading. That job alone took over three months of daily typing by Maree. There were many documents to prepare to accompany this expression of interest to demonstrate that we would meet the needs of the community if successful. These included a business plan, a community-based social participation plan, an inclusive statement, proof of financial viability and the statement that our existing relationship with the Redcliffe Scrabble Club would continue. After the council notified the club of our successful application, Maree's committee then supervised the extensive renovations that had to be made to the old Bowls Club and it was a time of intensive physical contribution and detailed organisation. Consultation with architects and engineers resulted in the installation of a new kitchen, changes to the roof structure, the installation of air-conditioning, electrical and plumbing requirements and so much more.

Maree introduced the first ever Melbourne Cup function in 2012 and catered for the lunch herself. In 2015, Maree introduced the first-ever President's Day into our club calendar and catered for the lunch that day. The following year, in 2016, Maree suggested that the club hold a lunch to raise funds for Martin

Smith, a local Paralympian. Martin had been chosen to represent Australia but he didn't have the funds to go to Rio de Janeiro. The club raised over \$3000 to support Martin and the suggestion was then made that our President's Day event should always be a fund-raiser for a local charity or worthy local cause.

Maree has always been a good ambassador for the club and a few years ago, conducted a High Tea at the Redcliffe Bridge Club to raise funds for "Shave for a Cure" for the Leukaemia Foundation. In 2024, Maree organized another "Shave for a Cure" at the club, resulting in Ted Morriss having his head shaved and raising \$1800. It should be noted that in 2002, Maree was awarded an OAM, an Order of Australia Medal for her services to the Leukaemia Foundation.

Maree certainly meets the criteria set down in the By-Laws for nomination for Honorary Life Membership and is a truly deserving candidate to receive this prestigious honour.

It gives me a great deal of pleasure to nominate Maree to be accepted as an Honorary Life Member of the Redcliffe Bridge Club.

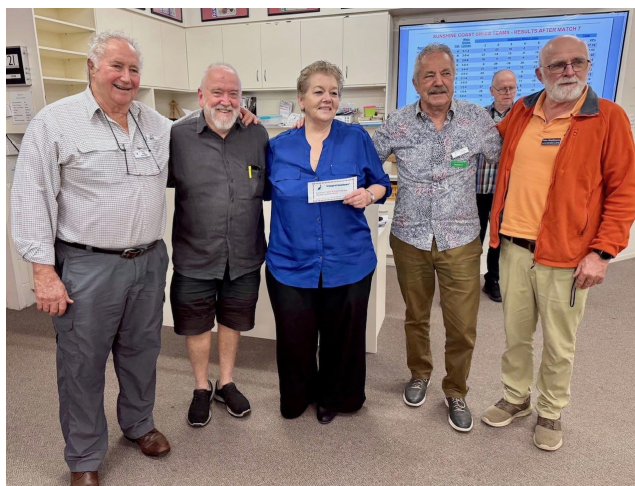

## Club Recorder

The function of the Recorder is to receive communications (oral or written) from individual players as to concerns that arise from incidents at an event or regular sessions of play.

If a player has an issue that is causing annoyance or embarrassment during a session of play, the Director is the first person available to address that issue.

If, for any reason, consulting with the Director is not an option, the Recorder is the person available to all players, whether it's a club situation or at an event such as a congress at another club. The name of the Recorder should be listed on the Conditions of Play provided for an event.

To facilitate such communications, the Recorder should be available immediately before and after each session. Details of the Recorder are listed on the club website and any player may seek a private conversation by phone or by email, subsequent to the event. Alternatively, the Director of the session may refer a complaint to the Recorder who will contact the complainant/s privately. All these communications are strictly confidential and are non-judgmental.

**By-Law 6 outlines** the details of the role of the Recorder.

**6.1** The Recorder is an experienced bridge player appointed to the position by the Management Committee of the Redcliffe Bridge Club.

**6.2** The Recorder's role is to consider issues relating to player behaviour referred by a session Director or by any club member. On referral of such an issue, the Recorder will informally and confidentially attempt to resolve the issue through advice to, and if necessary mediation between the member(s) involved.

**6.3** If the Recorder is unable to resolve an issue, he/she will make a formal written report to the Management Committee which will then assume responsibility for the resolution of the matter in accordance with By-Law 7.

**6.4** The Recorder will maintain a confidential written record of referred incidents and actions taken to resolve them, which he/she will make available to the Secretary of the Management Committee upon request.

**6.5** At any time, either as an alternative to a Recorder process; OR through the duration of a Recorder process; OR following the conclusion of a Recorder process, a complainant may elect to initiate a Grievance Procedure in accordance with Rules 12A to 12E inclusive. Once a Grievance Procedure has been initiated, Recorder processes, if any, cease immediately and decisions or determinations, if any, made under the Recorder process have no further effect.

## RELEASE 6.1 – JULY 2025

### A TECHNICAL UPDATE

A new version of My ABF has just been released. Most of what has been done this time is of a technical “behind the scenes” nature – upgrading component versions etc. So you will not notice much visible change. If you do notice anything behaving differently then please raise a Support issue. We have tested the whole system with the new components but of course it’s almost impossible to test everything 100% perfectly.

There are two things that are visible to users:

- Relevant to everyone – ability to print ABF masterpoint registration cards
- Relevant to tournament organisers – setting session times for events

#### 1. EVERYONE - ABF REGISTRATION CARDS

You may be aware that after 31 March this year the ABF decided not to print over 30,000 individual ABF Registration cards and physically mail them to clubs, for onward distribution to players. Enquiries have indicated that a large number of these cards never find their way to players at all, and many that do probably end up in the bin!

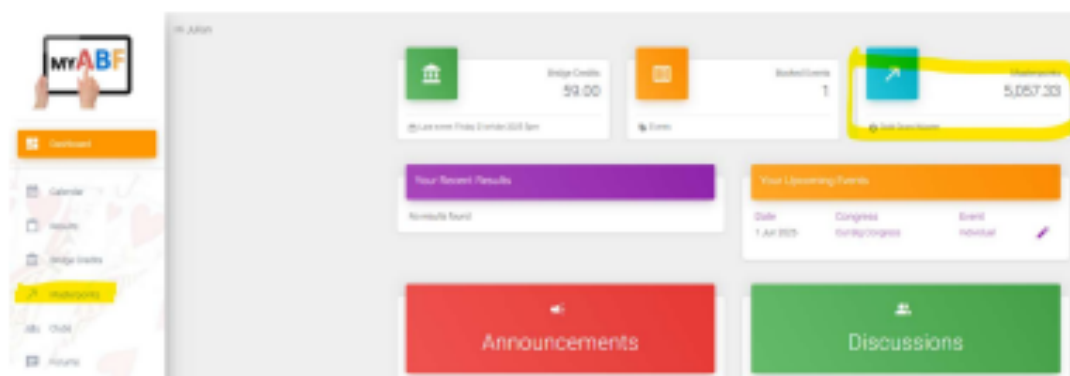
There is nothing on the card that cannot be found by a public search on the ABF Masterpoint Centre site anyway.

If you do, however, want to obtain a copy of your card (either in soft copy format or to print) we have added a facility to My ABF this year which will allow you to do so.

There are two ways you can do this – the first is only available to those who have registered for a My ABF account.

##### METHOD 1 - GENERATE YOUR OWN REGISTRATION CARD FROM WITHIN MY ABF

This can only be used by players who have registered for My ABF. When logged into My ABF, select Masterpoints – either from the left hand main menu or via the right most shortcut at the top of your dashboard:



On that screen you will see your own masterpoints:

Under your own masterpoint totals click “ABF Card Download”.

That will generate a pdf version of your card – you can then print that out or save it, or both.

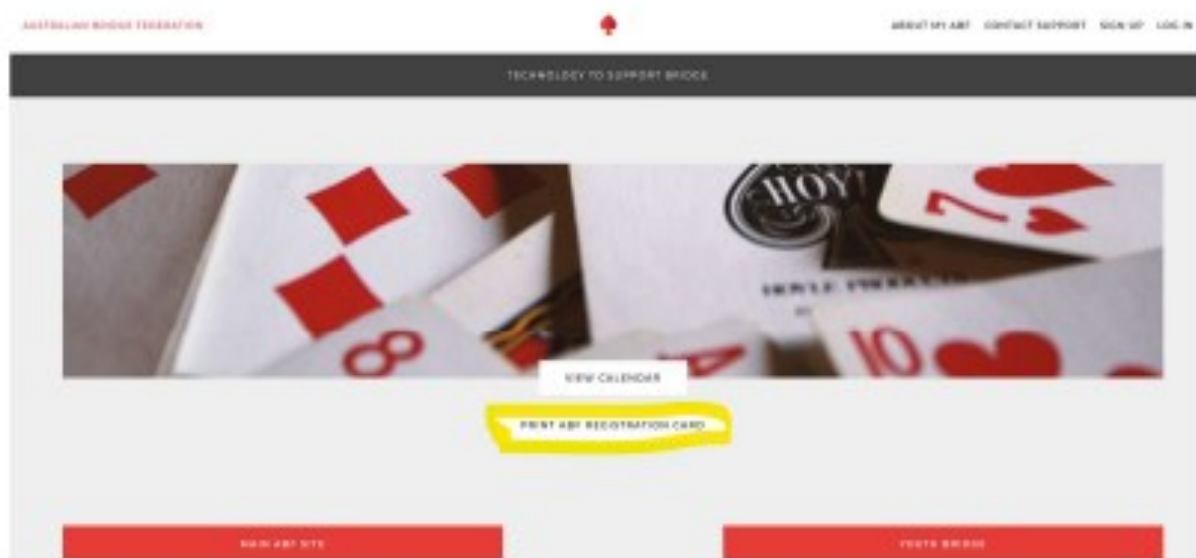
## METHOD 2 – GENERATE ANYONE’S REGISTRATION CARD OUTSIDE MY ABF

Anyone can use this method – including those players who have not yet registered for My ABF.

Go to the My ABF “Logged out” screen. This can most easily be accessed from the main ABF webpage via the links on the right:

This "logged out" page looks like this:



Click on Print ABF Registration Card.

That brings up the option to search for a player by name or ABF number:

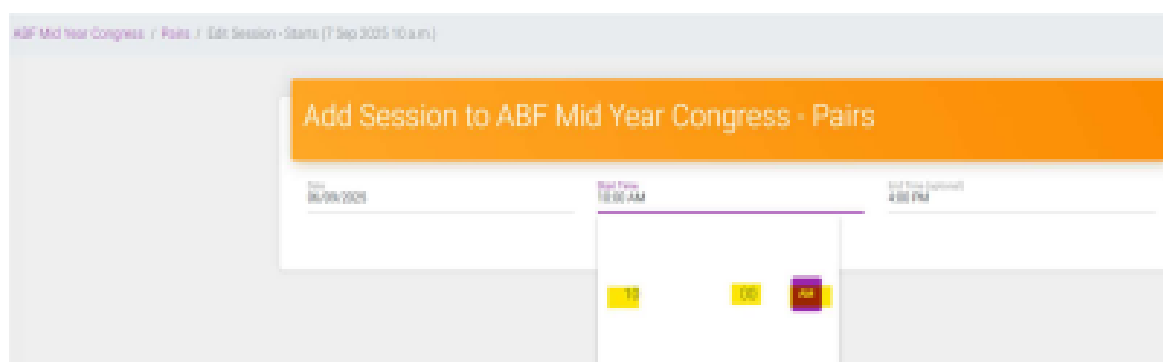
## 2. TOURNAMENT ORGANISERS – SETTING SESSION TIMES FOR EVENTS

When you are setting up events for listing in the calendar, there has been one change to the interface.

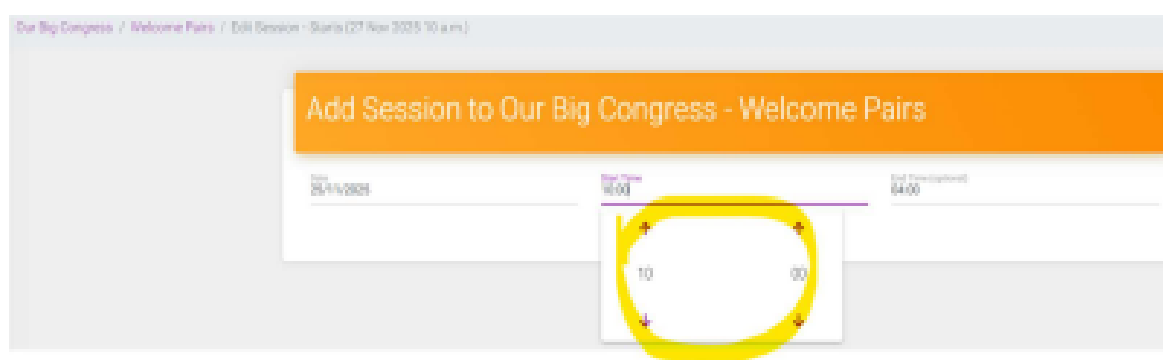
At step 6 of the setup process (Events) you create the Session times and these are used to build the Program of Events visible to players.

When adding those Session times it is now necessary to use the 24 hour clock (this is as a result of a change in the underlying component and we couldn't get it to work properly with AM/PM selections – at least not without spending a lot more of our developer's time that we felt was better employed elsewhere).

### CURRENT INTERFACE (AM/PM SELECTION):



### NEW INTERFACE (24 HOUR CLOCK SELECTION):



Note this is ONLY relevant for organisers when setting event times. The DISPLAY to players in the Program of Event continues to show AM/PM just like it always has.
