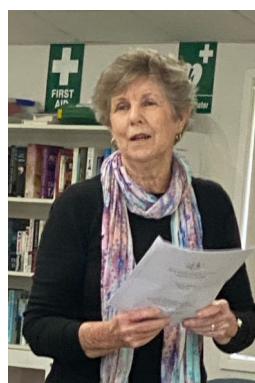

My ABF Update . . .

- We are commencing the very early stages of transferring the ABF masterpoint centre functions into My ABF. To do this, all clubs and all players will need to have a record in My ABF (whether they choose to actively use it is up to them).
- So we will soon be adding a record for each club not already in My ABF - based on the information that's already held for the club in the Masterpoint centre system. It will effectively replicate the list of clubs already in the Masterpoint Centre.
- It will sit dormant unless a club wishes to become active and use any My ABF features. The only thing visible will be a placeholder "profile" page for the club which contains just the information already in the ABF masterpoint centre.

There are now plenty of features a club might wish to use My ABF for - it's no longer purely just for congresses. It's much wider than that.
