During the past 3 Thursdays, GNOT sessions have been held to identify

teams that will represent our club at the Regional finals in August.
Congratulations to those teams. If you were unsuccessful the club will be holding further sessions on Friday 12/19 May during normal club sessions. These events provide club members with the opportunity to achieve some gold points. It is wonderful to see so many of our members now enjoying some special holidays that have been on hold for the past few years. Enjoy your travel and keep well.

President's Day—Monday 17 April

Play will be conducted at 12.30 pm during normal session times and will be conducted in two sections, namely Open and Novice. Nominations are not necessary. At the conclusion of play, multi draw raffles will occur with light refreshments provided.

have provided on average \$3,000 each for a young man in the special Olympics, Encircle, a domestic violence shelter, Peninsular Animal Aid, Pender Riding for Disabled, Rural Fire Brigade and Givit Flood Appeal. The charity that the club will support this year is Chameleon House, which operates on

Redcliffe Peninsula. They provide accommodation for young people 16-25 years, however they also support young people under 16 years to ensure their immediate welfare and safety. This charity provides an opportunity for people to take control of their lives in a supported system strength based environment, to begin the process for a better future.

The World Bridge Federation
President, Jan Kamras, flew to
Australia to Open the GCC and
discussed the World Bridge Tour,
of which players from Argentina,
Austria, Canada, Croatia, France,
Germany, Netherlands, New
Zealand, Sri Lanka, Sweden,
United Kingdom, Uruguay and USA
were present with the many from
all parts of Australia. The GCC
was the first event to count
towards the tour, similar to the
World Golf Tour. Two USA

players, aged 19, won the Open pairs; while 3 NSW reps and 1 Old rep won the Team event.

As you can imagine the field of Open competition in both the Pairs (194 pairs), Teams (144 teams) and the Swiss Pairs (112 pairs) was of a very high and competitive standard, where 10 Redcliffe players (Errol, Greg, Margaret, Annette, Fay, Peter, John, Abby, Maree, Sandra) competed. Any wins across these

events were difficult to achieve. I know I was feeling a bit intimidated when looking up some of my opposition on the ABF Masterpoints and seeing that they have 9000 MPS, mostly gold and red, but decided to focus on the cards not the opposition. And yes....they do make mistakes but not often, however we all achieved a few nice wins and came away with some hard earned gold points.
