## **Players Code of Conduct**

Il will be polite and courteous at all times.

I will respect other people's rights to have different opinions or ways of thinking. I will conduct my game in a proper, mature and inoffensive manner.

I will assist new members and guests and try to show patience

and understanding.

I will at all times abide by the Ethics Code and rules of my Bridge Club, my State/Territory Association and the ABF.

#### Role of the Club Recorder

Our Recorder is Sandra Routley.
In her role, she is an experienced player to whom players have recourse on complaints or suspicion of improper, unethical or discourteous behaviour by others in general matters which are not strictly the providence of the Director of the session.

The session Director may also refer a complaint to the Recorder.

An example of reportable incidents could include a person making disparaging remarks about another player, being aggressive or argumentative to another person or harassment.

If the Recorder is absent from a regular Club session, players may choose to communicate with the Recorder via telephone or email.

If the Recorder is unable to resolve an issue or if it is deemed that further investigation may be appropriate the Recorder shall make a formal written report to the Management Committee who will then assume ongoing responsibility for the resolution of the matter or instigate disciplinary proceedings in accordance with Rule 12 (2), By-Law 6, and By-Law 7.

The Recorder shall maintain a confidential written record of

referred incidents and actions taken on an Incident Report Form which will be available to the Secretary of the Management Committee on request.

The Recorder shall have the support of the Management Committee. Any discourtesy to the Recorder while exercising her functions will not be tolerated and the Management Committee will use its disciplinary powers to support the Recorder.

## Termite Update

As of the 16th November, it has been found that the termites are still alive. So the treatment continues. Termites are a group of etritophagous eusocial insects which consume a wide variety of decaying plant material, generally in the form of wood, leaf litter, and soil humus. They are distinguished by their moniliform antennae and the soft-

bodied and typically unpigmented worker caste for which they have been commonly termed "white ants"; however, they are not ants, to which they are distantly related. About 2,972 extant species are currently described, 2,105 of which are members of the family Termitidae. . . and we have one of them in our club house.
